Interfaith Learning Garden teaches families how to grow their own food, encouraging healthy and cost-effective means for providing for food security at home.

Designed for group use our Co-op Community Kitchen offers opportunities to gather, share and learn. The space is available for community programming, connect with us for more details.



Food Hampers provide 5-7 days of emergency food assistance. Households are eligible for one food hamper per calendar month and our Pick Room is available for perishable and surplus items 5 days per week. Various hamper options are available to accommodate special dietary needs and provide culturally appropriate foods:

BEYOND THE SEASON OF GIVING

It has been an incredibly busy year here at Interfaith Food Bank. With the rising prices of food and necessities it's no wonder that there has been a steady increase of over 40 new food bank clients month. Beyond this, we have seen a 75% increase in food bank use by working individuals. We are so grateful to be able to offer our clients all that we do, however, some days it's hard to keep food on our shelves with the increase in demand that seems to be never ending.

Glimpses of our impact can be seen in Sarah's story (name has been changed to respect our clients privacy). It had been a difficult few months that brought Sarah here, her first time applying to access services at a food bank. With thoughts going through her head like "How did it get to this?", Sarah never thought she would need a Food Bank. In fact, until very recently she had not thought about Food Banks at all. Upon entering Interfaith, she was welcomed and made to feel cared for. She was shown the pick room and chose some food items she could use. As she was leaving, a volunteer called her back. "Don't forget your food hamper!" She turned and looked at first in stunned silence at the hamper, and then began to cry. "That's all for me?"

Moments such as Sarah's remind us of the importance of providing emergency food assistance, and the true impact we

make in peoples lives each and every day. We are grateful to all the donors who help us fill our shelves and meet the needs of our clients. Whether you are able to contribute financially, through food donations, or by giving your time; your gift is a lifeline to others. From the bottom of our hearts, thank you.
